

This Agreement is the contract of deposit, which covers your and our rights and responsibilities concerning Membership and Account(s) offered to you. In this Agreement, the words “you” and yours” mean those who sign the Membership & Account Card (“Account Card”). The words “we,” “us,” and “our” mean Point West Credit Union (“Credit Union”). The word “account” means any one or more share or deposit accounts you have with the Credit Union.

The classification and form of ownership of your accounts are designated on your Account Card. By signing the Account Card that is a part of the Agreement, each of you, jointly and severally, agree to the terms and conditions in this Agreement including the Funds Availability Policy, Privacy Policy, Electronic Services, Truth-in-Savings Disclosures and Fee Schedule accompanying this Agreement, any account receipt, the Credit Union’s Bylaws and policies, and any amendments which collectively govern your Membership and Accounts. You agree that additional accounts and services you request in the future will be governed by this Agreement, as amended from time to time.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT PROCEDURES FOR OPENING A NEW ACCOUNT. To help the government fight the funding of terrorism and money laundering activities, federal law requires all financial institutions to obtain, verify, and record information that identifies each person who opens an account. What this means to you: When you open an account, we will ask for your name, address, date of birth, and other information that will allow us to identify you. We may also ask to see your driver’s license or other identifying documents.

I. Membership and Accounts

1. Membership Eligibility. To be eligible for membership in the Credit Union, you must be an individual or entity qualifying within the Credit Union’s field of membership and must purchase and maintain at least one share (the Membership Share Account) as required by the Credit Union’s Bylaws. You authorize us to check your account, credit history and obtain a credit report from third parties, credit reporting agencies, to verify your eligibility for the accounts and services that we may offer or for which you qualify.”

2. Individual Accounts. An individual account is an account owned by one depositor including any individual, corporation, partnership, trust, or other organization, qualified for Credit Union membership. If the account is an individual account, the interest of a deceased individual owner will pass, subject to applicable law, to the decedent’s estate or payable on death (“POD”) beneficiary, if applicable.

3. Joint Accounts. An account owned by two or more persons is a joint account.

a. Rights of Survivorship. If your account is a joint account, the account is owned as a joint account with rights of survivorship unless otherwise stated on the Account Card. If the account is a joint account without right of survivorship, the interest of a deceased owner will pass to the decedent’s estate. If the account is a joint account with right of survivorship, upon the death of one of the joint account owners, that person’s interest will become the property of the surviving joint account owners. A surviving owner’s interest is subject to the Credit Union’s statutory lien for the deceased owner’s obligations, and to any security interest or pledge granted by a deceased owner, even if a surviving owner did not consent to it.

b. Rights of Joint Account Owners. Any joint account owner is authorized and deemed to act for the other owner(s) and the Credit Union may accept orders and instructions regarding the account and requests for future services from any other account owner. Any account owner may withdraw all funds in the account, stop payment on items drawn on an account, withdraw, or pledge all or any part of the shares of any account, including funds representing a membership share, without the consent of the other account owner(s) and the Credit Union shall have no duty to notify any other joint account owner(s). If the Credit Union receives written notice of a dispute between account owners or receives inconsistent instructions from them, the Credit Union may suspend or terminate the account,

require a Court order to act, or require that all joint account owners agree in writing to any transaction concerning the account. If any owner grants a security interest in the account, the security interest will continue until the obligation is paid, even if the owner who grants the security interest dies.

c. Joint Account Owner Liability. If any item deposited in a joint account is returned unpaid or an account is overdrawn, or if we do not receive final payment on any transaction, each of the multiple account owners is jointly and severally liable to the Credit Union for the amount of the returned item, overdraft, or unpaid amount and any charges, regardless of who created the overdraft, deposited or cashed the item or benefited from the transaction. If any account owner is indebted to the Credit Union, the Credit Union may enforce its rights against any or all funds in the joint account regardless of who contributed the funds to the joint account.

4. POD Beneficiaries. A Payable on Death (POD) designation is an instruction to the Credit Union that a designated account is an account payable to the owner or owners during their lifetimes, and upon the death of the last joint account owner, payable to any named and surviving POD beneficiary designated on your Account Card. Accounts payable to more than one POD beneficiary are owned jointly by such beneficiaries with right of survivorship. Any POD beneficiary designation shall not apply to IRA accounts, which shall be governed by a separate beneficiary designation. The Credit Union shall at no time have any obligation to notify any beneficiary of the existence of any account or the vesting of the beneficiary's interest in any account, except as otherwise provided by law.

5. Accounts for Minors. For any account established by or for a minor, the Credit Union reserves the right to require the minor account owner to have a parental joint account owner or custodian who is at least eighteen (18) years of age who shall be jointly and severally liable to the Credit Union for any returned item, overdraft, or unpaid charges or amounts on such account. For a joint account, all funds in the account shall be owned as a joint account with rights of survivorship unless otherwise indicated on the Account Card. For a custodial account, all funds in the account shall be held by the custodian for the exclusive right and benefit of the minor. The Credit Union may make payments of funds directly to the minor with regards to his or her minority. Unless a parent or guardian is a joint account owner, the parent or guardian shall not have any right to access the account. The Credit Union has no duty to inquire of the use or purpose of any transaction by the minor or joint account owner. The minor account owner's tax identification number must be shown on the Account Card. The Credit Union shall not change the account status when the minor reaches age eighteen (18), unless authorized in writing.

6. Uniform Transfer to Minor Accounts. A Uniform Transfer to Minor Account (UTMA) is an individual account established by a member as a custodian on behalf of a minor (a person under twenty-one (21) years of age). The custodian shall open the account in the name of the minor, include the minor's social security number, and must sign his or her own name on the Account Card. The custodian is the owner of the account for the exclusive right and benefit of the minor and, barring a court order otherwise, is the only party entitled to make deposits to, withdrawals from, or close the account. In the event of the custodian's death, the Credit Union may place an administrative hold on the account until it receives instructions from any person authorized by law to withdraw funds or a court order authorizing such withdrawal.

7. Fiduciary Accounts. A fiduciary account is an account opened by an executor, administrator, personal representative, trustee, conservator, or other fiduciary in such capacity authorized under a will, court order or trust instrument establishing the fiduciary relationship or a Representative Payee authorized by the Social Security Administration ("fiduciary"). The account owner is the estate, conservatorship, trust or Social Security Administration benefit recipient as the sole owner of this account. The fiduciary is authorized to act on behalf of the account owner but has no ownership interest in the account. The fiduciary is the only authorized party to transact on this account. The fiduciary is expressly authorized to endorse all items payable to or owned by the Account owner for deposit with or collection by the Credit Union and to execute such other agreements and to perform any other account transaction under the Agreement. The fiduciary is authorized to receive account information from the Credit Union, either orally or in writing, and any information related to the account. The authority given to the fiduciary shall remain in full force until a court order, termination of the account owner or written notice of revocation is received by the Credit Union either by a court appointed representative of the account owner or by the Social Security Administration, as applicable. Any such notice shall not affect any items in process at the time notice is given. The fiduciary will notify the Credit Union of any change in the account owner's status affecting the

deposit relationship between the account owner and the Credit Union. The fiduciary warrants that all actions he or she takes regarding the account will be for the sole benefit of the account owner and that the fiduciary will not conduct any transaction on the account that will personally benefit the fiduciary or will not comply with the terms of the applicable laws, will, court order or instrument establishing the fiduciary relationship. The Credit Union may rely upon these representations and shall have no duty to examine such authorizing documents for compliance or inquire as to the powers and duties of the fiduciary and shall have no notice of any breach of fiduciary duties by the fiduciary unless the Credit Union has actual notice of wrongdoing. The account owner agrees that the Credit Union shall not be liable for any losses due to the account owner's failure to notify the Credit Union of any unauthorized acts of the fiduciary or changes to the relationship between the fiduciary and account owner. The account owner and fiduciary agree to indemnify and hold Credit Union harmless of any claim or liability as a result of unauthorized acts of the fiduciary upon which Credit Union relies prior to any actual notice of any account change or change of account owner.

8. Accounts of Businesses and Organizations. Accounts held in the name of a business or association member are subject to the same terms set forth in this Agreement and the following additional rules. The Credit Union reserves the right to require the member to provide a Business Account Resolution of Authority informing the Credit Union who is Authorized to act on its behalf. You agree to notify the Credit Union of any change in authority. The Credit Union may rely on the written authorization until such time as the Credit Union is informed of changes in writing and has had a reasonable time to act upon such notice. The Credit Union may require that third party checks payable to a business may not be cashed, but must be deposited to a business account. The Credit Union shall have no notice of any breach of fiduciary duties arising from a transaction by any agent of the account owner, unless the Credit Union has actual notice of any wrongdoing.

9. Deposit Requirements. Funds may be deposited to any account in any manner approved by the Credit Union in accordance with the requirements set forth on the Fee Schedule. All accounts are non-assignable and non-negotiable to third parties. Share Certificate accounts are governed by the terms of this Agreement and the terms and disclosures on your Share Certificate Receipt for each account, which is incorporated herein by this reference.

a. Endorsements. You authorize the Credit Union, in its discretion to accept transfers, checks, drafts, and other items for deposit into any of your accounts, whether or not they are endorsed by all payees. You authorize the Credit Union to supply missing endorsements if the Credit Union chooses to supply such endorsements. The Credit Union reserves the right to verify all endorsements on third party checks presented for deposit either in person or by comparison with member signature on file. If an insurance, government, and certain other checks or drafts require an endorsement as set forth on the back of the check. Endorsements must be placed in the space on the back of the check between the top edge and 1 1/2 inches from the top edge. The Credit Union may accept drafts or checks with endorsements outside this space. However, if any such endorsement or other markings you or any prior endorser make on the check cause any delay or error in processing the item for payment, you will be responsible for any loss incurred by the Credit Union due to the delay or error.

b. Collection of Items. The Credit Union shall not be responsible for deposits made by mail or at an unstaffed facility until the Credit Union actually receives them. In handling items for deposit or collection, the Credit Union only acts as your agent and assumes no responsibility beyond the exercise of ordinary care. The Credit Union will not be liable for default or negligence or any correspondent or for loss in transit, and each correspondent will only be liable for its own negligence. The Credit Union reserves the right to send any item for collection.

c. Final Payment. All items or Automated Clearing House ("ACH") transfers credited to your account are provisional and subject to our receipt of final payment. If final payment is not received, we reserve the right to charge your account for the amount of those items or ACH transfers and impose a return charge on your account. After we have received final payment, we refer to these deposits as collected items. If the Credit Union incurs any fee to collect any item, the Credit Union may charge such fee to your account. The Credit Union reserves the right to refuse or to return all or any item or funds transfer. The Credit Union shall have the right to charge back against your account all previously deposited items or other items endorsed by you that are returned to the Credit Union unpaid, regardless of whether the amount of the item has been available for your use.

d. Direct Deposits. The Credit Union may offer direct deposit options allowing you to preauthorize deposits (i.e., payroll checks, Social Security or retirement checks, or other government checks) or preauthorize transfers from other accounts at the Credit Union. You must authorize any direct deposits to your accounts by a separate authorization form. If applicable, you must notify the Credit Union at least thirty (30) days prior to any direct deposit or preauthorized transfer if you wish to cancel or change the direct deposit or direct transfer option. Upon a filing of a bankruptcy, if you fail to cancel any direct deposit authorization, you instruct your employer and the Credit Union to make and apply direct deposits in accordance with your authorization on file with the Credit Union. If the Credit Union is required to reimburse the U.S. Government for any benefit payment directly deposited into your account for any reason, you agree the Credit Union may deduct the amount returned from any of your accounts, unless prohibited by law.

e. Crediting of Deposits. Deposits made on Saturdays, Sundays, and Credit Union holidays will be credited to your account on the next business day. Ask for our current deposit cutoff time. Deposits received at unstaffed facilities will be credited on the day funds are removed and processed by the Credit Union. Items drawn from an institution located outside the United States are handled on a collection basis only. Funds will be credited to your account when we receive final payment. You waive any notice of nonpayment, dishonor, or protest regarding any items purchased or received by the Credit Union for credit to your account or for collection.

10. Account Access.

a. Authorized Signature. In order to access any account, the Credit Union must have an authorized signature of yours on an Account Card. The Credit Union is authorized to recognize your signature, but will not be liable for refusing to honor any item or instruction of yours if it believes in good faith that the signature on such item or instruction is not genuine. If you have authorized the use of a facsimile signature, the Credit Union may honor any draft that appears to bear your facsimile signature even if it was made by an unauthorized person. If you give your account number to a third person, you authorize us to honor transactions initiated by the third person even if you did not specifically authorize a particular transaction.

b. Access Options. You may make withdrawals or transfers from your account in any manner, which is permitted by the Credit Union (i.e., check, automated teller machines (ATMs), debit card, in person, by mail, automatic transfer, Online Banking, or telephone). If the credit union accepts any check or draft that is not drawn on a form provided by the credit union, you will be responsible for any loss incurred by the credit union for handling the check or draft. The Credit Union may return as unpaid any check that is not drawn in the form provided by the Credit Union.

c. ACH & Domestic Wire Transfers. If offered, you may initiate or receive credits or debits to your account via wire transfer or ACH ("Automated Clearing House") transfer. You agree that if you receive funds by a wire or ACH transfer, the Credit Union is not required to notify you at the time the funds are received. Instead, the transfer will be shown on your periodic statement. The Credit Union may provisionally credit your account for an ACH transfer before it receives final settlement for the transfer. You agree that if the Credit Union does not receive final settlement for a transfer, it may reverse the provisional credit to your account, or you will refund the amount to the Credit Union. When you initiate a wire transfer, you may identify either the recipient or any financial institution by name and by account number. The Credit Union (and other institutions) may rely on the account or other identifying number you give as the proper identification number, even if it identifies a different party or institution. Terms and conditions for international wire transfers will be provided at the time of the transfer transaction. Domestic Wire transfers are governed by the Uniform Commercial Code section 4A and Federal Reserve Regulation J if the transfer is cleared through the Federal Reserve. International wire transfers are governed by the Bureau of Consumer Financial Protection Regulation E. ACH transactions are governed by the rules of the National Automated Clearing House Association. You agree that the authorized transfer to or from your account must comply with all applicable federal and state laws or regulations including OFAC (Office of Foreign Asset Control) regulations.

d. International ACH Transactions. You understand that in the event an International ACH Transaction ("IAT") Entry that is transmitted to or from any of your accounts is identified and designated by the Credit Union's screening criteria for review and examination under the OFAC Rules and Regulations ("OFAC Rules"). The settlement of

such an IAT Entry may be delayed or suspended pending the Credit Union's review of the IAT Entry, and may be terminated under applicable OFAC Rules. You acknowledge that we may be required to place an indefinite hold on the funds covered by the IAT Entry if the IAT Entry is required to be terminated under the OFAC Rules. You agree that any delay described above will be a permissible delay under the regulations applicable to the availability of funds held in deposit accounts. In the event an IAT Entry is delayed or terminated, we will provide you such notice as may be required by applicable laws and regulations.

e. Credit Union Examination. The Credit Union may disregard information on any check other than the signature of the drawer and amount of the item and any magnetic encoded information. You agree the Credit Union does not fail to exercise ordinary care in paying an item solely because its procedures do not provide for sight examination of items.

f. Electronic Check Transactions.

i. Electronic Checks. If you authorize a merchant to electronically debit your checking account using the routing, account and serial number of your check to initiate the transfer, whether the check is blank, partially or fully completed and signed, such authorization is an electronic check conversion. An electronic check conversion is an electronic funds transfer ("EFT") subject to the terms of III. Electronic Services. You authorize us to honor any electronic check conversion from your checking account just the same as a regular written check.

ii. Electronic Re-presented Checks. If you write a check on a personal account that we return unpaid because of insufficient or uncollected funds, payee or any subsequent holder of the check may re-present the check to us, through an electronic instruction ("Electronic Re-presented Check") to charge your account for the amount of the check. If we receive an electronic re-presented check, we will pay or return the electronic re-presented check as if the original paper check was presented to us. Any collection fee you authorize the merchant to debit from your account is an electronic funds transfer subject to the terms of III. Electronic Services. If you want to reverse an electronic re-presented check, you must complete a Written Statement of Unauthorized Debit ("WSUD") within 15 days after we send or make available to you the periodic statement that reflects payment of that electronic re-presented check. In your WSUD, you must complete the WSUD stating that the electronic re-presented check was ineligible or unauthorized. If we receive a WSUD from you within the 15-day period, we will credit your account with the amount of the charge. If you wish to stop payment of any electronic re-presented check, you must follow the procedures contained in this Agreement for stopping payment of checks, not the procedures for stopping payment on electronic loan or bill payments. If you ask us to request the depositor's bank to send us the original paper check or a copy of the paper check, and we provide it to you, you agree that you will not seek to have your account reaccredited due to a prior stop payment order or if the item is otherwise ineligible for collection.

11. Account Rates and Fees. The Credit Union's payment of dividends on any account is subject to the account rates and fees, earnings, payment and balance requirements as set forth on the Fee Schedule and each Share Certificate Receipt (if applicable), which are incorporated herein by this reference. You agree the Credit Union may impose fees and charges for the deposit account services provided by the Credit Union. A current Fee Schedule has been provided to you separately. You agree the Credit Union may change the Fee Schedule from time to time and you will be notified of such changes as required by law.

12. Transaction Limitations.

a. Withdrawal Restrictions. The Credit Union will permit a withdrawal only if you have sufficient available funds in your account to cover the full amount of the withdrawal or have an established overdraft protection plan. Drafts or other transfer or payment orders which are drawn against insufficient available funds will be subject to a service charge, set forth in the Fee Schedule. If there are sufficient available funds to cover some but not all of your withdrawal orders, the Credit Union may allow those withdrawals for which there are sufficient available funds in any order at the Credit Union's discretion. The Credit Union may also refuse to allow a withdrawal in other cases; for example: any dispute between the owners about the account (unless a court has ordered the Credit Union to allow the withdrawal); a legal garnishment or attachment is served; the account secures an obligation to the Credit Union; any required documentation has not been presented; or you fail to repay a Credit Union loan on time. You

will be advised of the reasons for refusal if such action is taken. The Credit Union reserves the right to require members to give notice in writing of any intended withdrawals from any account (except checks) of not less than 7 days and up to 60 days, as required by law, before such withdrawal.

b. Transfer Limitations. For Share accounts and Access accounts, you may make up to six (6) preauthorized, automatic, telephonic, audio response, or Online Banking transfers to another account of yours or to a third party during any calendar month. A preauthorized transfer includes any arrangement with the Credit Union to pay a third party from the member's account upon oral or written orders, including orders received through the automated clearing house (ACH). There is no limit on the number of transactions you may make in the following manner: (i) transfers to any loan account with the Credit Union; (ii) transfers to another Credit Union account or withdrawals (checks mailed directly to you) when such transfer or withdrawal is initiated in person, by mail or at an ATM. If a transfer request would exceed the transfer limitations set forth above in any statement period, the Credit Union may refuse or reverse the transfer, and your account will be subject to suspension or closure by the Credit Union, and the Credit Union may impose a charge.

13. Overdrafts.

a. General Overdraft Liability. If on any day, the available funds in your checking account are not sufficient to cover checks and other items (ACH, debit card or ATM card transactions) posted to your account, those checks and items will be handled in accordance with our overdraft procedures and the terms of this Agreement. If we pay a check or item that overdraws your account, you are liable for and agree to pay the overdraft amount and an insufficient funds (NSF) fee immediately. If we do not pay the check or item, we will return it unpaid and you agree to pay a return item fee. We reserve the right to pursue collection of previously dishonored items at any time, including giving a payer bank extra time beyond any midnight deadline limits.

b. How We Process Checks. The Credit Union's determination of an insufficient account balance is made at the time the check or item is presented to us, which may be later during the day than the time you conduct the transaction. Overdrafts will be determined based on the available balance in your account at the time of presentment. Your available balance may be lower than your actual balance due to funds held for debit card transactions you have authorized and deposited checks held pursuant to our funds availability policy. You can view your available balance through Online Banking and at ATMs to avoid an overdraft. Transactions may not be presented in the order which they occurred and the order in which checks or items are received and processed may affect if an overdraft occurs. The Credit Union processes checks and items as follows: (i) checks are paid in the chronological order they are received, (ii) for ACH items, credits are processed first and ACH debits processed second with the lowest items paid first, and (iii) debit card transactions are paid in the chronological order they are received.

c. Overdraft Protection Plans. If we approve your request for overdraft protection, we will provide an overdraft protection plan for you:

i. Transfers from Savings. We will honor checks and other items drawn on insufficient funds in your checking account by transferring necessary funds from a savings account or other deposit account as you designate. If you have enough funds in your savings account, you authorize us to transfer funds in amounts necessary to cover the overdraft. If your savings account balance is insufficient to cover the overdraft amount, we will not make any transfer that overdraws your savings account. Unless another overdraft protection plan applies, we will return the check or item unpaid. There is an overdraft transfer fee for each overdraft transfer as set forth on the Fee Schedule. You may opt out of this overdraft transfer service at any time by notifying us verbally or in writing. Transfers from a savings account will be governed by this Agreement.

ii. Transfers from Line of Credit. We will honor checks and other items drawn on insufficient funds in your checking account by transferring the necessary funds from a line of credit account of yours, if applicable, unless you designate a different order. If you are within the credit limit of your line of credit account, you authorize us to transfer funds in amounts necessary to cover the overdraft. If your credit limit is insufficient to cover the overdraft amount, we will not transfer any amount. Unless another overdraft protection plan applies, we will return the check or item unpaid. There is no cash advance fee, but interest will begin to accrue from the date of any advance transfer. You may opt

out of this overdraft transfer service at any time by notifying us verbally or in writing. Your Loan Agreement will govern transfers from an overdraft line of credit account.

iii. Overdraft Protection Plan. The Credit Union offers the Overdraft Protection service to eligible consumer checking account owners (not available to minors or business account owners). Overdraft Protection service means that we may honor and pay your checks drawn against insufficient funds so that your checks are not returned unpaid. The Overdraft Protection Plan cannot be applied for and is made available only to members meeting specific qualifying criteria. In order to be eligible to receive Overdraft Protection you must be a member in good standing. Other qualifying criteria may apply. Not all members may qualify. Our Overdraft Protection Plan may apply to checks and other transactions you have drawn against insufficient funds in your checking account(s) with us, as well as other transfer or withdrawal request(s) you have authorized (such as, but not limited to, pre-authorized transfers) for which funds are insufficient. However, if you would like the Credit Union to provide Overdraft Protection service for one time debit (everyday/point-of-sale) card purchase transactions and ATM transactions (when available) you must specifically notify us to do so ("opt-in"). This overdraft service is not a line of credit, it is not guaranteed, and is independent of any other payment arrangement we may offer. We may, at our sole discretion, but are not obligated to, make payment on such overdrawn checks, transfers, and/or withdrawal requests in any order at our option or return the overdrawn checks, transfers, and/or withdrawal requests unpaid. Also, we may refuse to pay an overdraft for you at any time, even if we have previously paid overdrafts for you. Regardless, we are not liable for any action we take regarding payment or nonpayment of an overdrawn check, transfer, or withdrawal requests. If we choose to pay an overdrawn check, transfer, or withdrawal request, you will be subject to a fee(s) in the amount as set forth in the accompanying Fee Schedule for each transaction. In that event, you understand and agree that you are obligated to reimburse us and you are required to deposit with us sufficient good funds to cover the overdrawn check, transfer, or withdrawal request and pay the applicable fee(s). If we choose not to pay the overdrawn check, transfer, or withdrawal request, you are subject to the applicable fee(s) for each such item in the amount set forth in our Fee Schedule. We reserve the right to limit the number of overdrawn checks and the total dollar amount of overdrawn checks, transfers, and/or withdrawal request that may be paid under the Overdraft Protection Plan at any time. Generally, we will not pay an overdraft for you in excess of any limit we have established for your account type. Further, we do not guarantee payment of any overdrawn check, transfer, or withdrawal request. You understand that if we permit payment of an overdrawn check, transfer, or withdrawal request, we are not required to notify you. In addition, we may discontinue the Overdraft Protection Plan at any time without prior notice.

14. Postdated and Stale Dated Items. You authorize us to accept and pay any check, even if the check is presented for payment before its date, unless you notify the Credit Union of the postdating. Your notice will be effective only if the Credit Union receives the notice in time for the Credit Union to notify its employees and reasonable act upon the notice and you accurately describe the check, including the number, date, and amount. You understand that the exact information is necessary for the Credit Union's computer to identify the check. If you give the Credit Union an incorrect, incomplete, or untimely notice, the Credit Union will not be responsible for paying the item before the date stated and the Credit Union may charge your account as of the date the Credit Union pays the item. You may make an oral notice, which will lapse within fourteen (14) days unless continued in writing, within that time. A written notice will be effective for six (6) months. A written notice may be renewed in writing from time to time. You also agree not to deposit checks, drafts, or other items before they are properly payable. The Credit Union is under no obligation to you to pay a check or draft drawn on your account, which is presented more than six months after its date.

15. Stop Payment Orders.

a. Stop Payment Request. Stop Payment Request. You may ask the Credit Union to stop payment on any check drawn upon your checking account or any Automated Clearing House (ACH) transaction drawn upon your checking or savings account. You may request a stop payment by telephone, by mail, or in person. For checks and ACH, you may make an oral stop payment order, which will lapse within fourteen (14) calendar days unless continued in writing within that time. The stop payment will be effective if the Credit Union receives the order in time for the Credit Union to act upon the order and you state the number of the account, date and number of the item and its exact amount. A written stop payment order on a check will be effective for six (6) months. A written stop payment order may be renewed in writing from time to time. For ACH transactions, you may request a stop payment on a

single transaction, a series of transactions, or all future transactions related to a specific company.

If you give the Credit Union incorrect or incomplete information, the Credit Union will not be responsible for failing to stop payment on the item. If the stop payment order is not received in time for the Credit Union to act upon the order, the Credit Union will not be liable to you or to any other party for payment of the item. If we recredit your account after paying a check or ACH over a valid and timely stop payment order, you agree to sign a statement describing the dispute with the payee, to transfer all of your rights against the payee or other holders of the check or ACH to the Credit Union, and to assist the Credit Union in legal action taken against the person.

b. Duration of Order. You may make an oral stop payment order, which will lapse within fourteen (14) calendar days unless continued in writing within that time. A written stop payment order will be effective for six (6) months. A written stop payment order may be renewed in writing from time to time. The Credit Union is not obligated to notify you when a stop payment order expires. For ACH debits, the stop payment will be effective indefinitely when you choose to stop all future transactions related to a specific company. When a single transaction or a series of transactions is requested, the duration will cover the dates requested orally or as stated on the completed ACH Stop Payment Form if required.

c. Liability. The Credit Union may charge a fee for each stop payment order requested, as set forth on the Fee Schedule. You may not stop payment on any certified check or draft, cashier's check or teller's check, or any other check, draft, or payment guaranteed by the Credit Union. You should be aware that while payment of the item may be stopped, you may remain liable to any person, including the Credit Union, who is a holder of the item despite the stop payment order. You agree to indemnify and hold the Credit Union harmless from all costs, including attorney fees, damages or claims related to the Credit Union's action in refusing payment of an item, including claims of any multiple party account owner, payee or endorsee in failing to stop payment of an item as a result of incorrect information provided by you.

16. Lost Items. The Credit Union, in receiving items from you for withdrawal or deposit, acts only as your agent and reserves the right to reverse the credit for any deposited items or to charge your account for the items should they become lost in the collection process.

17. Credit Union's Liability for Errors. If the Credit Union does not properly complete a transaction according to the Agreement, the Credit Union will be liable for your losses or damages not to exceed the amount of the transaction, except as otherwise provided by law. The Credit Union will not be liable if: (a) through no fault of the Credit Union, your account does not contain enough money to make the transaction; (b) circumstances beyond the Credit Union's control prevents the transaction; (c) your loss is caused by your negligence or the negligence of another financial institution; or (d) the money in your account is subject to legal process or other claim. The Credit Union will not be liable for consequential damages, except liability for wrongful dishonor. The Credit Union's actions will constitute the exercise of ordinary care if such actions or nonactions are consistent with applicable state law, Federal Reserve regulations and operating letters, clearing house rules, and general banking practices followed in the area serviced by the Credit Union. You grant the Credit Union the right, in making payments of deposited funds, to rely exclusively on the form of the account and the terms of this Account Agreement. Any conflict between oral representations by you or Credit Union employees and any written form will be resolved by reference to this Agreement and applicable written form.

18. Credit Union Lien and Security Interest. To the extent you owe the Credit Union money as a borrower, guarantor, endorser or otherwise, the Credit Union has a lien on any or all of the funds in any account in which you have an ownership interest at the Credit Union, regardless of the source of the funds. The Credit Union may apply these funds in any order to pay off your indebtedness. If the Credit Union chooses not to enforce its lien, the Credit Union does not waive its right to enforce the lien at a later time. In addition, you grant the Credit Union a consensual security interest in your accounts and agree the Credit Union may use the funds from your accounts to pay any debt or amount owed the Credit Union, except obligations secured by your dwelling, unless prohibited by applicable law. All accounts are non-assignable and non-transferable to third parties.

19. Legal Process. If any legal action, such as a levy, garnishment, or attachment, is brought against your account, the Credit Union may refuse to pay out any money from your account until the dispute is resolved. If the Credit Union incurs any expenses or attorney fees in responding to legal process, such expenses may be charged against your account without prior notice to you, unless prohibited by law. Any legal process against your account is subject to the Credit Union's lien and security interest.

20. Account Information. Upon your request, the Credit Union will inform you of the name and address of each credit-reporting agency from which the Credit Union obtains a credit report in connection with your account. The Credit Union agrees not to disclose information to third parties about your account regarding any transaction or balances except when (1) it is necessary to complete the transaction; (2) the third party seeks to verify the existence or condition of your account in accordance with the Fair Credit Reporting Act or other applicable laws and regulations; (3) such disclosure is in compliance with the law, government agencies or court orders; or (4) you give us your written permission.

21. Notices.

a. Name or Address Changes. It is your responsibility to notify the Credit Union upon a change of address or change of name. The Credit Union is only required to attempt to communicate with you only at the most recent address you have provided to the Credit Union. The Credit Union may accept oral notices of a change in address and may require any other notice from you to the Credit Union be provided in writing to an employee of the Credit Union. If the Credit Union attempts to locate you, the Credit Union may impose a service fee as set forth on the Fee Schedule.

b. Notice of Amendments. Except as otherwise prohibited by applicable law, the terms of this Agreement are subject to change at any time. The Credit Union will notify you of any changes in account terms, rates, or fees as required by law. Changes in account ownership, such as adding or removing a joint account owner, must be evidenced by a signed Membership & Account Card, which, upon execution, will be incorporated herein by this reference. The Credit Union reserves the right to waive any term in this Agreement. Any such waiver shall not affect the Credit Union's right to enforce any right in the future.

c. Effect of Notice. Any written notice you give to the Credit Union is effective when it is actually received by the Credit Union. Any written notice the Credit Union gives to you is effective when it is deposited in the U.S. Mail, postage prepaid and addressed to you at your statement mailing address. Notice to any one account owner is considered notice to all owners of the account.

d. Notice of Negative Information. We may report information about your account to credit bureaus. Late payments, missed payments, or other defaults on your account may be reflected in your credit report.

e. Consent to Communications. By providing an email address, telephone number for cellular phone, or other wireless device, you are expressly consenting to receiving communications at that address or number, including, but not limited to, prerecorded or voice mail message calls, text messages, and calls made by an automatic telephone dialing system from us and our affiliates and agents. This express consent applies to each address or telephone number that you provide to us now or in the future and permits such communication regardless of their purpose. In the regular course of our service to you, we may monitor and record phone conversations made or received by our employees. You agree that we will have this right with respect to all phone conversations between you and our employees, whether initiated by you or any of our employees. For payment authorizations you provide by telephone, we may require you to confirm such instructions in writing.

f. Electronic Signatures. You understand and agree that your electronic consent is your electronic signature which specifically records your signature and assent to the Membership and Account Agreement and constitutes your agreement to the terms and conditions of the Membership and Account Agreement. You agree your electronic signature captured and stored as an image by this electronic means shall be sufficient to evidence of your assent to be contractually bound by the Agreement and shall constitute a valid signature for purposes of any provision of this Agreement.

22. Taxpayer Identification Numbers (TIN) and Backup Withholding. If your account is or becomes subject to backup withholding, the Credit Union is required by law to withhold and pay to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) a required percentage of payments of interest, dividends and certain other payments under certain conditions. Your failure to furnish a correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) or meet other applicable requirements may result in backup withholding as well as civil or criminal penalties. If you refuse to provide your TIN, the Credit Union may suspend the opening of your account, or you may request a non-dividend bearing account until a TIN is provided.

23. Statements.

a. Contents. If the Credit Union provides a statement for your account, you will receive a periodic statement of all transactions and activity on your account during the statement period. If a periodic statement is provided, you agree that only one statement is necessary for a multiple party account. For checking accounts, you understand that, when paid, your original check becomes property of the Credit Union and may not be returned to you, but copies will be retained by the Credit Union or a payable through financial institution and made available upon your request. You understand statements and checks are made available to you on the date the statement is mailed to you.

b. Examination. You are responsible for examining each statement reporting any irregularities to the Credit Union. The Credit Union will not be responsible for any forged, altered, or unauthorized item drawn on your account if (1) you fail to notify the Credit Union within thirty (30) days of the mailing date of the earliest statement and availability of checks containing any forgery, alteration, or unauthorized signature on the item; or (2) any items forged or altered in a manner not detectable by a reasonable person including the unauthorized use of a facsimile signature machine.

c. Notice to Credit Union. You agree that the Credit Union's retention of drafts does not alter or waive your responsibility to examine your statements and draft copies or the time limit for notifying the Credit Union of any errors. The statement will be considered correct for all purposes and the Credit Union will not be liable for any payment made or charged to your account unless you notify the Credit Union in writing within the above time limit after the statement and checks are made available to you. If you fail to receive a statement, you agree to notify us within 14 days of the time you ordinarily receive it.

d. Electronic Statements (eStatements). If your statement is provided electronically, statements will be: (1) electronically mailed to you as an attachment; or (2) you will be sent a notice via e-mail that will direct you to a site we maintain or cause to be maintained where you may access, review, print and otherwise copy/download your periodic statements using procedures we authorize. E-mails from us will be sent to the e-mail address provided by the account owner. The mailing date is the date the Credit Union notifies you of the statement availability.

24. Inactive and Abandoned Accounts. If you have an account that you have not made a withdrawal from, deposit to, or transfer involving your account for more than one (1) year and the Credit Union has been unable to contact you by regular mail during that period, the Credit Union may classify your account as an inactive account and may charge an inactive account service fee as allowed by applicable law and set forth on the Fee Schedule. Thereafter, dividends will be paid on the account unless the balance falls below any minimum balance requirement. The Credit Union will notify you at your last known address prior to imposing any fee as required by law. Checking accounts will continue to incur the monthly maintenance fee until closed by the member. You authorize us to transfer funds from an available share or access account of yours to cover the monthly maintenance fee, if necessary. If a deposit or withdrawal has not been made on the account and the Credit Union has had no other contact with you for three (3) years as required by the Uniform Unclaimed Property Act, the account will be presumed to be abandoned. Funds in abandoned accounts will be remitted in accordance with state law. Once funds have been turned over to the state, the Credit Union has no further liability to you for such funds and if you choose to reclaim such funds, you must apply to the appropriate state agency.

25. Death of Account Owner. The Credit Union may require the survivor or other claimant to the account to produce certain documents before releasing the funds in the account. The Credit Union may continue to honor all

transfers, withdrawals, deposits and other transactions on the account until the Credit Union learns of an account owner's death. Once the Credit Union learns of a member's death, the Credit Union may pay checks or honor other payments or transfer orders authorized by the deceased member for a period of ten (10) days unless the Credit Union receives instructions from any person claiming an interest in the account to stop payment on the checks or other items. You agree that the Credit Union can require that anyone who claims funds in your account after your death to indemnify the Credit Union for any losses resulting from honoring that claim.

26. Termination of Account. The Credit Union may terminate your account at any time without notice to you or may require you to close your account and apply for a new account if (1) there is a change in owners or authorized signers; (2) there has been a forgery or fraud reported or committed involving your account; (3) there is a dispute as to the ownership of the funds in the account; (4) any account checks are lost or stolen; (5) if there are excessive returned unpaid items not covered by an overdraft protection plan; (6) if there has been any misrepresentation or any other abuse of any of your accounts; (7) we reasonably deem it necessary in order to prevent a loss to the Credit Union. In other cases, the Credit Union may close your account with reasonable notice. You may terminate your account at any time by notifying the Credit Union by oral direction or in writing. The Credit Union is not responsible for payment of any check, withdrawal or other item once your account is terminated; however, if the Credit Union pays a check after termination, you agree to reimburse the Credit Union for payment.

27. Termination of Membership. You may terminate your membership at the Credit Union after giving written notice of your intent to withdraw from membership. You may be denied services or expelled from membership for any reason allowed by applicable law, including causing a loss to the Credit Union.

28. Special Account Instructions. You may request the Credit Union to facilitate certain trust, will, or court-ordered account arrangements. However, because the Credit Union does not give legal advice, we cannot counsel you as to which account arrangement most appropriately meets the specific requirements of your trust, will, or court order. If you ask the Credit Union to follow instructions that the Credit Union believes might expose it to claims, suits, lawsuits, expenses, liabilities, or damages, whether directly or indirectly, the Credit Union may refuse to follow your instructions or may require you to post a bond to indemnify the Credit Union. Any item presented with a full payment legend must be presented in person to a Credit Union officer; otherwise, payment is accepted with full reservation of rights. Account changes requested by you, or any account owner, such as adding or closing an account or service, must be evidenced by a signed Account Card and accepted by the Credit Union. The Credit Union will not recognize the authority of someone to whom you have given power of attorney without written authorization and a copy of the Power of Attorney on record at the Credit Union.

29. Severability. In the event that any paragraph of this Agreement or any portion thereof is held by a court to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the other paragraphs and portions of this Agreement shall not be invalid or unenforceable and will continue in full force and effect.

30. Enforcement. You agree to be liable to the Credit Union for any liability, loss, or expense as provided in this Agreement that the Credit Union incurs as a result of any dispute involving your accounts or services. You authorize the Credit Union to deduct any such liability, loss, or expense from your account without prior notice to you. In the event either party brings a legal action to enforce the Agreement or collect any overdrawn funds on accounts accessed under this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled, subject to applicable law, to payment by the other party of its reasonable attorney's fees and cost, including fees on any appeal, bankruptcy, proceedings, and any post-judgment collection actions, if applicable.

31. Governing Law. This Agreement is governed by the Bylaws of the Credit Union, federal laws and regulations, the laws and regulations of the state of Oregon and local clearinghouse rules, as amended from time to time. Any disputes regarding this Agreement shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the court of the county in which the Credit Union is located.

II. Funds Availability Policy

1. General Policy. Our policy is to make funds from your deposits available to you on the next business day that we receive your deposit. Electronic direct deposits will be available on the same business day we receive the deposit. Once the funds are available, you can withdraw the funds in cash and we will use the funds to pay checks that you have written. For determining the availability of your deposits, every day is a business day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and federal holidays. If you make a deposit before 5:00 p.m. on a business day that we are open, we will consider that day to be the day of your deposit. However, if you make a deposit after 5:00 p.m. or on a day we are not open, we will consider that the deposit was made on the next business day we are open.

2. Reservation of Right to Hold. In some cases, we will not make all of the funds that you deposit by check available to you on the next business day after we receive your deposit. Depending on the type of check that you deposit, funds may not be available until the second business day after the day of your deposit. However, the first \$225.00 of your deposit will be available on the first business day. If we are not going to make all of the funds from your deposit available on the first business day, we will notify you at the time you make your deposit. We will also tell you when the funds will be available. If your deposit is not made directly to one of our employees, or if we decide to take this action after you have left the premises, we will mail you the notice by the day after we receive your deposit.

3. Holds on Other Funds. If we cash a check for you that is drawn on another financial institution, we may withhold the availability of a corresponding amount of funds that are already in your account. Those funds will be available at the time funds from the check we cashed would have been available if you had deposited it. If we accept for deposit a check that is drawn on another financial institution, we may make funds from the deposit available for withdrawal immediately but delay your availability to withdraw a corresponding amount of funds that you have on deposit in another account with us. The funds in the other account would then not be available for withdrawal until the time periods that are described elsewhere in this disclosure for the type of check that you deposited.

4. Longer Delays May Apply. We may delay your ability to withdraw funds deposited by check into your account an additional number of days for these reasons:

- We believe a check you deposit will not be paid.
- You deposit checks totaling more than \$5,525.00 on any one day.
- You deposit a check that has been returned unpaid.
- You have overdrawn your account repeatedly in the last six months.
- There is an emergency, such as failure of communications or computer equipment.

We will notify you if we delay your ability to withdraw funds for any of these reasons, and we will tell you when the funds will be available. They will generally be available no later than the seventh business day after the day of your deposit.

5. Special Rules for New Accounts. If you are a new member, the following special rules will apply during the first 30 days your account is open. Funds from electronic direct deposits to your account will be available on the same day we receive the deposit. Funds from deposits of cash, wire transfers, and the first \$5,525.00 of a day's total deposits of cashier's, certified, teller's, travelers, and federal, state, and local government checks will be available on the first business day after the day of your deposit if the deposit meets certain conditions. For example, the checks must be payable to you. The excess over \$5,525.00 will be available on the ninth business day after the day of your deposit. If your deposit of these checks (other than a U.S. Treasury check) is not made in person to one of our employees, the first \$5,525.00 will not be available until the second business day after the day of your deposit. Funds from all other check deposits will be available on the ninth business day after the day of your deposit.

6. Deposits at Automated Teller Machines. Funds from any deposits (cash or checks) made at automated teller machines ("ATMs") that are owned and operated by the Credit Union will not be available until the second business day after the day of your deposit. Funds from any deposits made at ATMs that are not owned or operated by the Credit Union will not be available until the fifth business day after the day of your deposit.

7. Deposits through Mobile Deposit. Mobile deposit items may have up to a three (3) business day hold once posted to your account. Unless you are otherwise notified, mobile deposit limits are ten (10) items per month or a

total of \$5,000.00, whichever comes first, with a daily limit of \$1,500.00.

III. Electronic Services

By signing the Account Card or signing or using the Visa Debit Card (“Debit Card”), or using any electronic funds transfer services, you agree to the following terms governing your and our rights and responsibilities concerning the electronic funds transfer services, as applicable. Terms and conditions set forth elsewhere in the Agreement shall also apply to your electronic funds transfer service. Electronic funds transfers (“EFT’s”) are electronically initiated transfers of money through direct deposits, automated teller machines (“ATM’s”), Point of Sale (“POS”) terminals involving your deposit accounts at the Credit Union, audio response transactions, Online Banking transactions, and Visa Debit Card purchase.

1. Electronic Services.

a. ATMs. You may use your Debit Card and Personal Identification Number (PIN) in automated teller machines as the Credit Union may designate. At the present time, you may use your Card to make the following transactions on your share and share draft accounts or your access and share draft accounts, whichever you choose:

- Make deposits to your accounts.
- Withdraw cash from your accounts.
- Make balance inquiries on your accounts.
- Transfer funds between your accounts.
- Other transactions as offered and permitted in the future.

i. Withdrawals. There is no limit on the number of withdrawals you may make at Credit Union ATM’s and nonproprietary ATM’s. However, you may be charged a fee as set forth on the Fee Schedule. You may withdraw up to \$500 (if there are sufficient funds in your account) per day at any authorized ATM, subject to limits placed on each individual ATM. Higher daily limits may be available for qualified account holders.

ii. Deposits. You may make deposits only at ATM’s designated by the Credit Union. Because of the servicing schedule and processing time required in ATM operations, there is a delay between the time a deposit (either cash or check) is made and when it will be available for withdrawal. Deposits are subject to verification by the Credit Union. You should review the Credit Union’s Funds Availability Policy to determine the availability of funds deposited at ATM’s.

iii. Transfers. You may transfer between your share and share draft accounts up to the balance in your accounts at the time of the transfer at available locations.

b. Visa Debit/Point of Sale (POS). You may use your Debit Card to purchase goods and services any place Visa Debit Card are accepted by participating merchants. Funds to cover your Debit Card purchases will be deducted from your checking account. If the balance in your account is not sufficient to pay the transaction amount, the Credit Union may treat the transaction as an overdraft request pursuant to the overdraft protection plan or may terminate all services under this Agreement. If we approve your application for Point of Sale (POS) services, you may use your Debit Card and Access code to pay for purchases from merchants who have agreed to accept Visa Debit Cards at such POS terminals as the Credit Union may designate. There is no limit on the number of purchase transactions you may make with your Debit Card during a statement period. No purchase may exceed the available funds in your account. The Credit Union reserves the right to refuse any transaction which would draw upon insufficient funds, lower an account below a required balance, or otherwise require us to increase our required reserve on the account. You may not use your Debit Card for any illegal or unlawful transaction, and we may decline to authorize any transaction that we believe poses an undue risk of illegality or unlawfulness. The Credit Union may set other limits on the amount of any transaction, and you will be notified of those limits. The Credit Union may refuse to honor any transaction for which you do not have sufficient available verified funds.

c. Direct Deposit. Upon instruction of (i) your employer or (ii) the Treasury Department or (iii) other financial

institutions, the Credit Union will accept direct deposits of your paycheck or of Federal recurring payments, such as Social Security.

d. Audio Response. If we approve the audio response access service for your accounts, you must designate a separate four (4) digit access code. You must use your access code along with your account number to access your accounts. At the present time, you may use the audio response access service to:

- Obtain balance information on your accounts at the Credit Union.
- Transfer funds between your share and share draft accounts.
- Withdraw funds from your share or share draft accounts by check, made payable to you and mailed to you at your mailing address.

Your accounts can be accessed under audio response via a Touch-Tone telephone only. Not all push button phones are Touch-Tone. Converters may be purchased by pulse and rotary dial phones. Audio response service will be available for your convenience seven (7) days per week. This service may be interrupted for a short time each day for data processing. If you call during this time you will hear, "Unavailable at this time." Check withdrawals must be made prior to 4:00 p.m. Pacific Standard time to assure same day posting. While there is no limit to the number of inquiries, transfers, or withdrawal requests you may make in any one day, there are certain limitations on transfers from share and money market accounts. Transfers from a share or a money market account will be limited to six (6) in any one month. No transfer or withdrawal may exceed the available funds in your account. The Credit Union reserves the right to refuse any transaction which would draw upon insufficient funds, exceed a credit limit, lower an account below a required balance, or otherwise require us to increase our required reserve on the account. Check transactions may not exceed the amount in your account.

There is a \$10,000 limit on any transfer. All checks are payable to you as a primary member and will be mailed to your address of record. The Credit Union may set other limits on the amount of any transaction, and you will be notified of those limits. The Credit Union may refuse to honor any transaction for which you do not have sufficient available verified funds. There is no limit on the number of transaction requests you may make during a single phone call. The system will time-out after 30 seconds if no transaction is entered, and after ten minutes in all cases. If you wish to make any further transactions, you will have to call back. The system will also time-out after three unsuccessful attempts to enter a transaction.

e. Online Banking Services. Upon approval, you the primary member may use your personal computer to access your accounts. You must use your member number along with a security code to access your accounts. If you share your member number along with your security code with another individual including a joint account holder the credit union is not responsible for any transactions made on your behalf. If you fail to maintain or change the security of these access codes and the Credit Union suffers a loss, we may terminate your electronic funds transfer and account services immediately. You may not use your account services for illegal or unlawful transactions, and the Credit Union reserves the right to refuse to complete a transaction that the Credit Union believes poses an undue risk of illegality or unlawfulness.

The Online Banking service is accessible seven (7) days a week, 24 hours a day. However, from time to time, some or all of the Credit Union's Online Banking services may not be available due to system maintenance. You will need a personal computer and a web browser. The online address for the Online Banking service is <https://www.pointwestcu.com>. You are responsible for the installation, maintenance and operation of your computer. The Credit Union will not be responsible for any errors or failures involving any telephone service or your computer.

You may use the Online Banking service to:

- Transfer funds between your Savings, Checking and Money Market accounts.
- Transfer funds from your Checking and Savings account to a loan account.
- Review account balance, and transaction history for Checking, Savings, Money Market, Certificate, and IRA accounts.
- Review information on your loan account including payoff amounts, due dates, finance charges, interest

- rates, balance information and past statements of yours.
- Make bill payments from your checking account using the Bill Pay service.
- Request a withdrawal from any Savings, Checking, or loan account by check mailed to you.
- Transfer funds from your share or share draft account to a loan account of yours or any other member's account.
- Other transactions as offered and permitted in the future.

Transactions involving your deposit accounts will be subject to the terms of your Membership and Account Agreement and transactions involving a line of credit account will be subject to your Loan Agreement and Disclosure, as applicable. The following limitations on Online Banking transactions may apply:

i. Transfers. You may make funds transfers to your other accounts as often as you like. However, transfers from your savings or money market accounts will be limited to a total of six (6) in any one month. You may transfer or withdraw up to the available balance in your account or up to the available credit limit on a line of credit at the time of the transfer, except as limited under this Agreement or your deposit or loan agreements. The Credit Union reserves the right to refuse any transaction that would draw upon insufficient or unavailable funds, lower an account below a required balance, or otherwise require us to increase our required reserve on the account. All checks are payable to you as a primary member and will be mailed to your postal address of record. The Credit Union may set other limits on the amount of any transaction and you will be notified of those limits.

ii. Account Information. The account balance and transaction history information may be limited to recent account information involving your accounts. Also, the availability of funds for transfer or withdrawal may be limited due to the processing time for any ATM deposit transactions and our Funds Availability Policy.

iii. E-Mail. You may use e-mail to send messages to us. E-mail may not, however, be used to initiate a transfer on your account or a stop payment request. The Credit Union may not immediately receive e-mail communications that you send and the Credit Union will not take action based on e-mail requests until the Credit Union actually receives your message and has a reasonable opportunity to act. If you need to contact the Credit Union immediately regarding an unauthorized transaction or stop payment request, you may call the Credit Union at the telephone number set forth in III. Electronic Services, Section 3.

f. Bill Pay Service. When you apply for the Bill Pay Service, you must designate your Checking Account as the account from which payments that you authorize will be deducted. You will be given the ability to set up merchants, institutions or individuals that you would like to pay. You are not permitted to designate governmental agencies or courts. We reserve the right to not allow the designation of a particular merchant or institution. You or any persons who you have authorized to use your Bill Pay Service, Online Banking Service, sign-on Password or any access code can perform the following transactions:

- Pay any designated merchant, institution or individual in accordance with this agreement a fixed recurring amount or a variable amount "on demand," from your designated Checking Account.
- Obtain information (payee information, payment status information, etc.) about your Bill Pay account status.
- Bill Pay Transactions. You authorize us to process bill payments from your designated account. You may use the Bill Pay service to initiate three different types of payment transactions:
 - "On demand" payments are payments that are not reoccurring. The payments can be canceled or changed through Bill Pay up until 12:00 Midnight before your Scheduled Debit Date.
 - "Future" payments are payments that you initiate each payment by setting the payment amount and due date. The payment can be canceled or changed through Bill Pay up until 12:00 Midnight before the Scheduled Debit Date.
 - "Recurring" payments are payments that are reoccurring on a fixed due date and fixed amount. You have an option in the Bill Pay system to set Automatic Payments to continue indefinitely or set a maturity date. The payment can be canceled or changed through Bill Pay up until 12:00 Midnight before the Scheduled Debit Date.

i. Authorized Payments. When you transmit a bill payment instruction to us, you authorize us to transfer funds to

make the bill payment transaction from your checking account or any other account you designate. We will process bill payment transfer requests only to those payees the Credit Union has designated in its User Instructions and such payees as you authorize and for whom the Credit Union has the proper payee code number. The Credit Union will not process any bill payment transfer if we know the required transaction information is incomplete. In any event, the Credit Union will not be liable for any transaction that contains incorrect information that the Credit Union was not responsible for entering or knowing. If there are insufficient funds in your account to make the bill payment request, we may either refuse to make the payment or make the payment and transfer funds from any overdraft protection account you have established. The Credit Union reserves the right to refuse to process payment instructions that reasonably appear to the Credit Union to be fraudulent or erroneous.

ii. Processing Payments. The amount of your requested bill payments will be deducted from your account on the Scheduled Debit Date and will be posted within two business days of the date that the payment is transmitted to the payee. You will receive a confirmation number at the time of each transaction. Therefore, you must have sufficient funds available to cover your payment on the Scheduled Initiation Date.

Bill payments are delivered to the payee either electronically, which may take up to five business days from the Scheduled Debit Date, or by check to those payees not set up to accept electronic payments, which may take up to ten business days from the Scheduled Debit Date. It is your responsibility to schedule your bill payments in such a manner that your obligations will be paid on time. You should enter and transmit your bill payment instructions at least ten (10) business days before a bill is due. If you do not allow sufficient time, you assume full responsibility for any late payments or finance charges that may be imposed as a result of your failure to transmit a timely bill payment authorization.

iii. Canceling or Changing Bill Payments. Payments designated as “on demand” transactions cannot be stopped, canceled or changed once your Bill Pay session has ended. You may cancel or stop payment on Future and Recurring bill payment instructions under certain circumstances by following the instructions provided. If you discover an error in or want to change a payment instruction (i.e., payment date or payment amount) for a bill payment that you have already scheduled for transmission through the Bill Pay service, you may electronically edit or cancel your payment request through the Bill Pay service. Your cancellation request must be entered and transmitted through the Bill Pay service before the date you have scheduled for payment. If your request is not timely entered, you will be responsible for the payment.

If you wish to place an oral stop payment on a recurring bill payment transaction, not using the Bill Pay service, the Credit Union must receive your oral stop payment request at least three (3) business days before the Scheduled Debit Date. You may call the Credit Union at the telephone number set forth in III. Electronic Services, Section 3 to request a stop payment. If you call, the Credit Union may require you to confirm your stop payment request in writing within 14 days after the call.

g. Mobile Banking Service. Account Access. If we approve your application for the Mobile Banking service, you may use your handheld device to access your accounts. To access the Mobile Banking service, you will need a handheld device, a personal computer and access to the Internet (World Wide Web). You must use your password along with your account number to access your accounts. The Mobile Banking service is accessible 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. You are responsible for the installation, maintenance, and operation of the software and your handheld device and for making sure you know how to use the Mobile Banking software. The Credit Union will not be responsible for any errors or failures involving any telephone or cable Internet service, software installation, or malfunctions of your home or work handheld device and related equipment. You may experience technical or other difficulties related to use of the Mobile Banking service that results in loss of data, personalization settings or other service interruptions. We assume no responsibility for the timeliness, deletion, misdelivery, service interruptions, or failure to store any user data, communication, or personalization settings in connection with your use of the Mobile/ Online Banking service.

Types of Transactions. At the present time, you may use any of the Mobile Banking services to:

- Transfer funds between your checking and savings account and money market and loan accounts.
- Transfer funds from your savings or checking account to a loan account of yours, or to another member's account as authorized.
- Transfer funds from your savings or checking account to other external financial institutions as authorized.
- Review account balance and account transaction information for any of your accounts.
- Request stop payment orders on your checking account.
- Communicate with the Credit Union using the electronic mail (E-mail) feature.

Transactions involving your deposit accounts will be subject to your Membership and Account Agreement and transactions involving a loan account will be subject to your Consumer Loan Agreement and Disclosures.

h. Electronic Check Transactions. You authorize us to honor any electronic check conversion transaction and re-presented check fee debit transactions you authorize ("electronic check transactions"). You agree that your authorization for an electronic check transaction occurs when you initiate such a transaction after receiving any notice regarding the merchant's right to process the transaction. Notice may include a sign posted by the merchant at the time and place of your transaction. All terms governing electronic funds transfer services will apply to electronic check transactions, except the \$50 and \$500 limits of liability for unauthorized transactions in III. Electronic Services, Section 3, Member Liability. You remain responsible for notifying us of any unauthorized electronic check transaction shown on your statement.

2. Access and Use of Account. The use of your Debit Card and Account are subject to the following conditions:

a. Ownership of Cards. Any Debit Card or other device which we supply to you is our property and must be returned to us, or to any person whom we authorize to act as our agent, or to any person who is authorized to honor the Debit Card, immediately according to instructions. The Debit Card may be repossessed at any time in our sole discretion without demand or notice. You cannot transfer your Debit Card or Account to another person.

b. Authorization. If you the primary member authorize anyone to use your access code, card, or Online Banking service in any manner, that authority will be considered unlimited in amount and manner until you specifically revoke such authority by notifying the Credit Union and changing your access code immediately. You are responsible for any transactions made by such persons until you notify us that transactions and access by that person are no longer authorized and your access code is changed. If you fail to maintain or change the security of these access codes and the Credit Union suffers a loss, we may terminate your electronic funds transfer and account services immediately. You may not use your account access code, card, or Online Banking service for illegal or unlawful transactions, and the Credit Union reserves the right to refuse to complete a transaction that the Credit Union believes poses an undue risk of illegality or unlawfulness.

c. Security of Access Code. The personal identification number or access code that you select is for your security purposes. The access code is confidential and should not be disclosed to third parties or recorded. You are responsible for safekeeping your access code. You agree not to disclose or otherwise make your access code available to anyone not authorized to sign on your accounts. If you authorize anyone to have or use your access code, you understand that person may use the Online or Mobile Banking service to review all of your account information and make account transactions. Therefore, we are entitled to act on transaction instructions received using your access code and you agree that the use of your access code will have the same effect as your signature authorizing transactions. If you authorize anyone to use your access code in any manner that authority will be considered unlimited in amount and manner until you specifically revoke such authority by notifying the Credit Union and changing your access code immediately. You are responsible for any transactions made by such persons until you notify us that transactions and access by that person are no longer authorized and your access code is changed. If you fail to maintain or change the security of these access codes and the Credit Union suffers a loss, we may terminate your electronic funds transfer and account services immediately.

d. Foreign Transactions. Purchases and cash advances made in foreign countries will be billed to you in US dollars. The currency conversion rate for international transactions as established by Visa International, Inc. is a rate selected

by Visa from the range of rates available in wholesale currency markets for the applicable central processing date, which rate may vary from the rate Visa itself receives, or the government-mandated rate in effect for the applicable central processing date. If there is a currency conversion, you will be charged a foreign transaction fee of 1% of the transaction amount for any card transaction made in a foreign country.

e. Illegal Use of Internet Gambling. You agree that all transactions that you initiate by use of your Visa Debit Card are legal in the jurisdiction where you live and/or where the transaction occurred. Internet gambling may be illegal in the jurisdiction in which you are located, including the United States. Your Visa Debit Card may only be used for legal transactions. Display of a payment card logo by an online merchant does not mean that Internet gambling transactions are lawful in all jurisdictions in which you may be located. We have restricted all online gambling transactions with the Visa Debit Card.

f. Non-Visa Checking Transactions Processing. We have enabled non-Visa Debit transaction processing. This means you may use your Visa Debit Card on a PIN-Debit Network* (a non-Visa network) without using a PIN. The non-Visa Check network(s) for which such transactions are enabled are the STAR Network. Examples of the types of actions that you may be required to make to initiate a Visa transaction on your Visa Debit Card include signing a receipt, providing a card number over the phone or via the Internet, or swiping the card through a point-of-sale terminal. Examples of the types of actions you may be required to make to initiate a transaction on a PIN-Debit Network include initiating a payment directly with the biller (possibly via telephone, Internet, or kiosk locations), responding to a logo displayed at a payment site and choosing to direct payment through that network, and having your identity verified using known information derived from an existing relationship with you instead of through use of a PIN. The provisions of your agreement with us relating only to Visa transactions are not applicable to non-Visa transactions. For example, the additional limits on liability (sometimes referred to as Visa's zero-liability program) and the streamlined error resolution procedures offered on Visa Debit Card transactions are not applicable to transactions processed on a PIN-Debit Network and the liability rules for other EFTs in III. Electronic Services, Section 3, Member Liability will apply. Visa rules generally define PIN-Debit Network as a non-Visa Debit network that typically authenticates transactions by use of a personal identification number (PIN) but that is not generally known for having a card.

3. Member Liability. You are responsible for all transfers you authorize using your EFT services under this Agreement. If you permit other persons to use an EFT service, card, access code, or Online Banking service, you are responsible for any transactions they authorize or conduct on any of your accounts. However, tell us at once if you believe anyone has used your account, card or access code and accessed your account without your authority. Telephoning is the best way of keeping your possible losses down. For Visa Debit Card purchase transactions, if you notify us immediately of your lost or stolen card you will not be liable for any losses, provided you were not grossly negligent or fraudulent in handling your Visa Debit Card and you provide us with a written statement regarding your unauthorized Visa Debit Card claim, otherwise the liability limits set forth below may apply. For all other EFT transactions, if you tell us within two (2) business days, you can lose no more than \$50 if someone accessed your account without your permission. If you do not tell us within two (2) business days after you learn of the unauthorized use of your account or EFT service, and we can prove that we could have stopped someone from accessing your account without your permission if you had told us, you could lose as much as \$500. Your liability for unauthorized loan transactions through an EFT service will not exceed \$50, provided you were not grossly negligent or fraudulent in handling your card.

Also, if your statement shows EFT transfers that you did not make, tell us at once. If you do not tell us within sixty (60) days after the statement was mailed to you, you may be liable for the full amount of the loss if we can prove that we could have stopped someone from making the transfers if you had told us in time. If a good reason (such as a hospital stay) kept you from telling us, we will extend the time periods.

If you believe your Debit Card or access code has been lost or stolen or that someone has transferred or may transfer money from your account without your permission, call: 503.546.5000/ 888.468.5826 or write: Card Services | Point West Credit Union PO Box 11999 | Portland, OR 97211.

4. Business Days. Our business days are Monday through Friday. Holidays are not included.

5. Fees and Charges. There are certain charges for electronic fund transfer services as set forth on the Fee Schedule. From time to time, the charges may be changed. We will notify you of any changes as required by law. If you request a transfer or check withdrawal from your line of credit account, such transactions may be subject to charges under the terms and conditions of your Visa Credit Card Agreement. If you use an ATM that is not operated by us, you may be charged an ATM surcharge by the ATM operator or an ATM network utilized for such a transaction. The ATM surcharge will be debited from your account if you elect to complete the transaction.

6. Right to Receive Documentation of Transfers.

a. Periodic Statements. Transfers and withdrawals transacted through any electronic funds transfer service will be recorded on your periodic statement. You will receive a statement monthly unless there is no transaction in a particular month. In any case, you will receive a statement at least quarterly.

b. Direct Deposits. If you have arranged to have a direct deposit made to your account at least once every sixty (60) days from the same source and you do not receive a receipt (such as a pay stub), you can find out whether or not the deposit has been made by calling the phone numbers listed above. This does not apply to transactions occurring outside the United States.

c. Terminal Receipt. You will receive a receipt at the time you make a transaction using an ATM, POS terminal or with a participating Visa merchant, except some electronic terminals will not provide receipts for transactions of \$15 or less.

7. Account Information Disclosure. We will disclose information to third parties about your account or the transfers you make:

- As necessary to complete transfers;
- To verify the existence of sufficient funds to cover specific transactions upon the request of a third party, such as a credit bureau or merchant;
- To comply with government agency or court orders;
- If you give us your written permission.

8. Credit Union Liability for Failure to Make Transfers. If we do not complete a transfer to or from your account on time or in the correct amount according to our agreement with you, we will be liable for your losses or damages. Our sole responsibility for an error in a transfer will be to correct the error. However, there are some exceptions. We will not be liable for instance:

- If, through no fault of ours, you do not have adequate funds in your account to complete a transaction, your account is closed, or the transaction amount would exceed your credit limit on your line of credit, if applicable.
- If you used the wrong access code, used an access code or Debit Card in an incorrect manner, or you have not properly followed any applicable computer, or Credit Union user instructions for making transfer and bill payment transactions.
- If the Debit Card has expired or is damaged and cannot be used.
- If the automated teller machine (ATM) where you are making the transfer does not have enough cash or was not working properly and you knew about the problem when you started the transaction.
- If circumstances beyond our control (such as fire, flood, telecommunication outages, postal strikes, equipment or power failure) prevent making the transaction.
- If the funds in your account are subject to an administrative hold, legal process or other claim.
- If you have not given the Credit Union complete, correct and current instructions so the Credit Union can process a transfer.
- If the error was caused by a system of any participating ATM network, or a system beyond the Credit Union's

control such as a telecommunications system, an Internet service provider, any computer virus or problems related to software not provided by the Credit Union.

- If your computer fails or malfunctions or the phone lines or Credit Union computer system was not properly working and such problem should have been apparent when you attempted such transaction.
- If, through no fault of ours, a bill payment or funds transfer transaction does not reach a particular payee due to changes in the payee address, account number or otherwise; the time you allow for payment delivery was inaccurate; or the payee failed to process a payment correctly, or in a timely manner, and a fee, penalty, or interest is assessed against you.
- There are other exceptions as established by the Credit Union from time to time.

9. Termination of Electronic Fund Transfer Services. You agree that we may terminate this Agreement and your electronic fund transfer services if:

- You, or any authorized user of your access code or Debit Card breach this or any other agreement with us;
- We have reason to believe that there has been an unauthorized use of your Debit Card or access code;
- You breach any provisions of your Membership and Account Agreement or any other agreement with the Credit Union; or
- Your membership in the Credit Union is terminated for any reason.

You or any other party to your account can terminate this Agreement by notifying us in writing. Termination of service will be effective the first business day following receipt of your written notice. However, termination of this Agreement will not affect the rights and responsibilities of the parties under this Agreement for transactions initiated before termination.

10. Notices. The Credit Union reserves the right to change the terms and conditions upon which this service is offered. The Credit Union will mail notice to you at least twenty-one (21) days before the effective date of any change, as required by law. Use of this service is subject to existing regulations governing the Credit Union account and any future changes to those regulations.

11. Statement Errors. In case of errors or questions about your electronic transfers, telephone us at the phone numbers or write us at the address set forth above as soon as you can. We must hear from you no later than sixty (60) days after we sent the first statement on which the problem appears.

- Tell us your name and account number.
- Describe the transaction you are unsure about, and explain as clearly as you can why you believe it is an error or why you need more information.
- Tell us the dollar amount of the suspected error.

If you tell us orally, we may require that you send us your complaint or question in writing within ten (10) business days.

We will tell you the results of our investigation within ten (10) business days after we hear from you and will correct the error promptly. For errors related to transactions occurring within thirty (30) days after the first deposit to the account (new accounts), we will tell you the results of our investigation within twenty (20) business days. If we need more time, however, we may take up to forty-five (45) calendar days to investigate your complaint or question (ninety (90) calendar days for POS transaction errors, new account transaction errors, or errors involving transactions initiated outside the United States). If we decide to do this, we will re-credit your account within ten (10) business days (five (5) business days for Visa Debit Card purchase transactions) for the amount you think is in error, so that you will have the use of the money during the time it takes us to complete our investigation. If we ask you to put your complaint or question in writing and we do not receive it within ten (10) business days, we may not re-credit your account.

If we decide after our investigation that an error did not occur, we will deliver or mail to you an explanation of our

findings within three (3) business days after the conclusion of our investigation. If you request, we will provide you copies of documents (to the extent possible without violating other members' rights to privacy) relied upon to conclude that the error did not occur.

12. ATM Safety Notice. The following information is a list of safety precautions regarding the use of Automated Teller Machines (ATM).

- Beware of your surroundings, particularly at night.
- Consider having someone accompany you when the ATM is used after dark.
- If another person is uncomfortably close to you at the time of your transaction, ask the person to step back before you complete your transaction.
- Refrain from displaying your cash at the ATM. As soon as your transaction is completed, place your money in your purse or wallet. Count the cash later in the safety of your car or home.
- If you notice anything suspicious at the ATM, consider using another ATM or coming back later. If you are in the middle of a transaction and you notice something suspicious, cancel the transaction, take your ATM access device or deposit envelope, and leave.
- If you are followed after making a transaction, go to the nearest public area where people are located.
- Do not write your personal identification number or access code on your ATM card.
- Report all crimes to law enforcement officials immediately.
